

CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

In Board of Aldermen, March 26, 1889,

Ordered,

That the West End Street Railway Company be authorized to lay down five hundred feet of double track of the "Providence girder rail" so called, at such place on Main Street, as the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges may designate, the pavement to be set three-fourths of an inch below the surface of the rail, on both sides,

Provided that the aforementioned work shall be laid upon such terms and conditions as shall be prescribed by the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges, and

Provided further, that the Company be required to furnish a suitable bond to save the city harmless from any liability that may result from the laying of said track,
