James L. Canavan is a life long resident of Cambridge who attended the Sacred Heart Grammar School prior to his attendance at Cambridge High and Latin School where he enrolled with the Class of 1925, and

James L. Canavan answered the call to the colors in World War II and enlisted in the Coast Guard and served for a period of thirty-three months aboard a subchaser operating out of Little Creek, Virginia and later saw combat action in the Leyte Campaign and the Okinawan invasion aboard LST 762 where he survived fifty-seven Kamikaze attacks after successfully landing elements of the famed First Marine Division on the beach, and

WHEREAS:

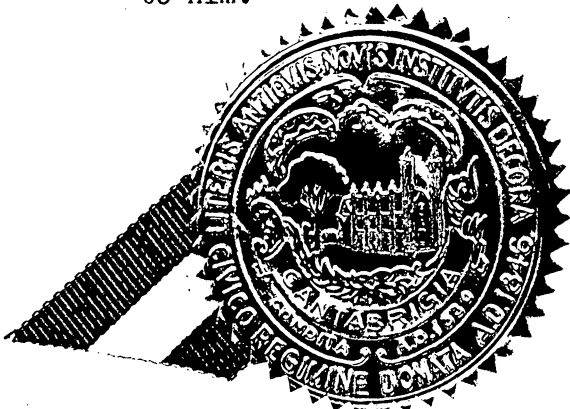
James L. Canavan in peace and in war exemplified the highest ideals of citizenship and earned the respect of all who knew him by his enthusiasm, and therefore be it
