- WHEREAS: Approximately 12,000 school transportation vehicles are currently registered in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to carry an estimated 600,000 students on a daily basis; and
- WHEREAS: School buses are the safest means of transportation in the country; and
- WHEREAS: The school transportation needs and safety of all students in the Commonwealth are of fundamental concern; and
- WHEREAS: Many citizens of the Commonwealth are directly involved in school bus safety as teachers, school bus drivers, parents and students; and
- WHEREAS: The Registry of Motor Vehicles, through its mandate to insure the proficiency of school bus drivers, the proper maintenance of school transportation vehicles and the safety of all school children, calls attention to school bus safety during this National School Bus Safety Week; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council do hereby proclaim September 22-28, 1985 as

"SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK"

in Cambridge and urge all citizens, educators and community leaders to take note of this event and to participate fittingly in its observance.
