IN CITY COUNCIL

COUNCILLOR WYLIE

RESOLVED:

That the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, U.S.A., hereby resolves to request the appropriate officials of Sudan to make public the reasons for the arrest of Sadiq El-Mahdi, Nasraddin El-Hadi, Murarak El-Mahdi, Essadit Hamid, El-Fadil Mahmoud Bakr, and Abdulrahman El-Nur, and to advise whether their rights are being observed under the United National Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As elected government officials in a democratic society, the Cambridge City Councillors wish to say to Sudanese officials that political activity should never result in the violation of a person's liberty, and further that disregard of the personal rights of members of political opposition creates a destabilizing force in the world.

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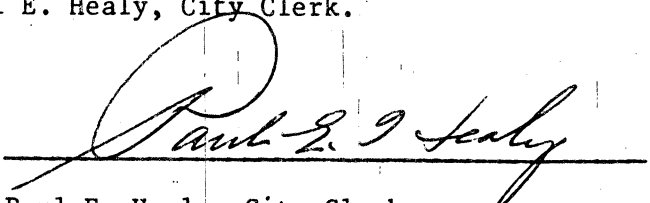

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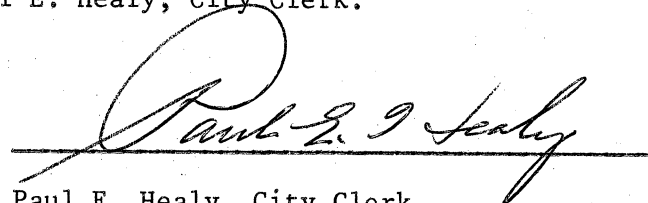
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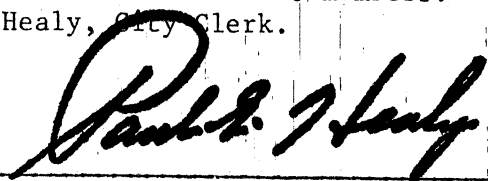
