COUNCILLOR D. SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: The imposition of Proposition 2½ and federal budget reductions require the city to raise revenue in every available manner, consistent with fairness and ability to pay, so as to continue the delivery of necessary public services; and
- WHEREAS: The 1981 report of the Cambridge 2½ Citizens Task Force recommended alcoholic beverage license fees as a promising source of additional revenue; and
- WHEREAS: In 1981, the state Legislative significantly increased the maximum fees which could be charged, subject to determination by the local licensing authorities, in Cambridge the Board of License Commissioners; and
- WHEREAS: By its Order No. 17 of October 19, 1981, co-sponsored by Councillors Vellucci, Walter Sullivan, and David Sullivan and passed unanimously, the City Council sought to maximize these fee revenues without unfairly burdening smaller establishments by requesting the License Commissioners to adopt a graduated fee schedule based on volume and seating capacity; and
- WHEREAS: No report from the License Commissioners has yet been received in response to that order; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager obtain from the License Commissioners a report on their compliance with this city policy within two weeks.
