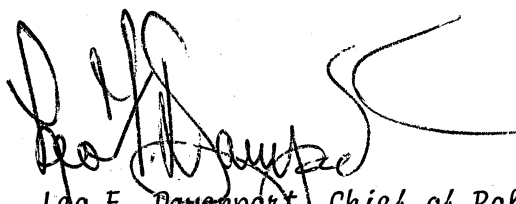

REFERENCE: One-way Violations

In answer to the City Council order of May 5, 1980, calling for enforcement of one-way street violations, be assured that enforcement action will be initiated immediately.

The problem of one-way violations in the Greenough-Ellsworth Avenue area has been referred to the Commander of the Traffic Unit of the Cambridge Police. He, in turn, will instruct the men under his command to frequent the area and note the times on their daily log.

It is also the duty of all uniform personnel to acquire a thorough knowledge of all criminal law as well as all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations relating to motor vehicles -- with particular attention to those elements which constitute violations. This knowledge is to be used to enforce the parking ordinances and motor vehicle laws in all areas of the city.

In conclusion, traffic enforcement is an important part of the police mission in the City of Cambridge. The fact the Cambridge Police Department has issued over 36,500 motor vehicle violations in the last five years supports our commitment to save lives, reduce injuries and improve driving habits. This, in turn, will make Cambridge a safer place for all.

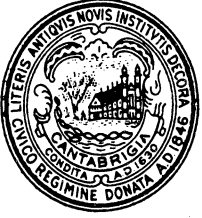

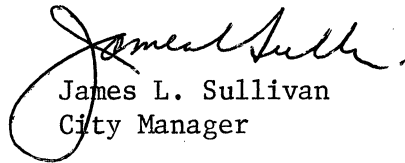
