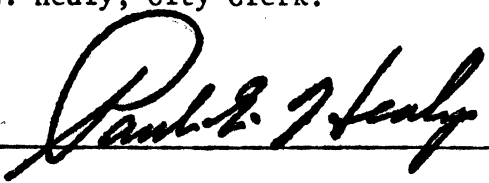

- ORDERED: That the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to issue a sidewalk sales permit; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Health Department be and hereby is requested to issue a permit for the sale of food and beverages outdoors; and be it further
- ORDERED: That these permits be granted subject to the following conditions:-
1. That the Harvard Square Business Association provide six private security officers to maintain peace and order during this event.
 2. That the Harvard Square Business Association provide the necessary personnel to clean up the Oktoberfest area and public toilet facilities.

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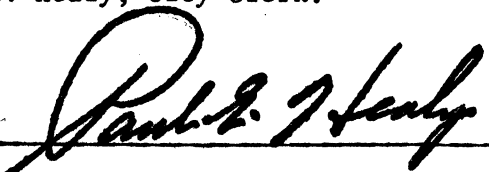

Dear Mr. Mayor:

On behalf of the Harvard Square Business Association, I would like to request permission to hold our seventh annual Oktoberfest on Sunday, October 13th (with a raindate on Columbus Day, October 14th) of this year. As in the past, we hope the City Council will grant permission for us to hold a one-day outdoor festival and street fair on Brattle and John F. Kennedy street starting at noon and lasting until dusk (or approximately 5:30pm). The Harvard Square Oktoberfest would again feature authentic Bavarian entertainment, but would restrict beer and wine sales to a cordoned off area of John F. Kennedy street between Mt. Auburn and the intersection of Brattle street.

The Business Association plans to hire six special-duty police officers, supplemented by Cambridge Auxillary Police for traffic control. We will provide public toilets and arrange for clean-up afterwards. We will also require permission from the Department of Traffic and Parking and from the MBTA, in order to close the section of Kennedy street from Church to Mt. Auburn street and part of Brattle Street from Kennedy st. to Brattle square. We are applying for a one-day wine and malt beverage license from the Cambridge License Commission.

We would very much appreciate your input regarding our request, and, if it is granted, we hope you will see fit to kick off the festivities in your capacity as Mayor of Cambridge.

Thank you for your prompt consideration of this matter.
