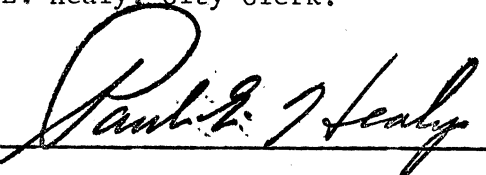
IN CITY COUNCIL

- WHEREAS: A Cambridge program of preventing automobile arson has become a model for other communities; and
- WHEREAS: This program has succeeded in reducing Cambridge automobile fires from an average 38 per month in 1984, to fewer than five per month in 1985; and
- WHEREAS: This success results from long hours and great skill exercised by the Cambridge Fire Department's arson investigations, working in close cooperation with insurance companies, the District Attorney, and the State Fire Marshal; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council commends the Cambridge Fire Department for this latest addition to its excellent reputation, and especially congratulates the arson squad and Inspector Edward Fowler; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council also commends and thanks District Attorney Scott Harshbarger and Assistant District Attorney Jeffrey Locke, Chief of the arson division, for their essential role in this program; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk send copies of this resolution to Chief Scott, Inspector Fowler, District Attorney Harshbarger, and Assistant District Attorney Locke, on behalf of the entire City Council.
