WHEREAS: Jack Reilly has for forty-one years been a significant presence in Cambridge's club scene, initially as manager of the Club Casablanca in Harvard Square from 1957 to 1969 and as manager of the Ha' Penny Pub in 1969-1970; and

WHEREAS: Jack Reilly in 1970 started Jacks, on Massachusetts Avenue in Central Square, which quickly achieved popular success as a destination music club and spawning ground for emerging local and regional folk and rock musicians alike; and

WHEREAS: Jack Reilly in 1976 opened Ryles as a jazz club in Inman Square and helped to initiate the revival of this area and the re-emergence of jazz entertainment in Cambridge and the Boston area; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the entire Cambridge City Council join with Jack Reilly's family and generations of his friends, to celebrate his remarkable achievements, to recognize him also as a father, grandfather, brother, veteran and friend to many an employee, musician and patron, and to congratulate Jack for his contributions to our community, with the hope that he will be able to continue to be part of the livelihood and diversity of our City for many years to come; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to Jack Reilly on the occasion of the celebration of his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday.
