Subject City Council Order #31 of October 15, 1979-"Establishing
A New Visitor Parking Permit"

I have been aware of a number of our Visitor Permits being re-produced and we have been looking into ways and means of correcting this. After meeting with many printing companies, we found that to completely stop this practise would increase the cost of producing these permits to ten times the cost we now pay. This would mean special paper and a two colored permit.

I will in next year's budget ask for funds to do this but seeing as this year's permits are already in stock, I will be introducing another color to them so that if they are copied they would come out all one color thereby making it easier for our Parking Control Officers to notice.

We have so far this year, through our numbering system revoked 142 Visitor Permits of the people who allowed theirs to be copied. We will continue to monitor them with the hope of minimizing these copies. We also feel that with a tri-colored permit next year, we could virtually reduce these copies to a handful.

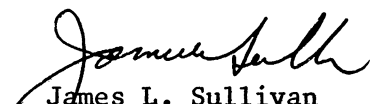
