The Joint Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges to which was referred the petition of George T. Partridge and others, praying for the acceptance and widening of Burn Street so-called, Reply.

This street is a narrow way leading from Brattle street, southerly to Foster street, between Millard and Sparks streets. It is a little over 19 feet wide at the Brattle street end, and about 20 feet at the other end. Some of the owners of lands upon the street are willing to release, but the principal ones are not. The street is in no proper condition for acceptance and in the judgment of your committee the public necessity and convenience does not require the same. For the same reason that has governed the committee in similar cases, - to wit, the lack of any appropriation for new street, - it is recommended that the petitioners have leave to withdraw.
