RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record urging the Massachusetts Congressional delegation to take all steps necessary to create extended vouchers which last for periods of five to ten years for expiring use tenants who live in buildings where mortgages are prepaid; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the MDC be requested to keep the City Council informed of any such steps.
