- WHEREAS: Grace E. McLellan was a dedicated public servant who began her career in the public service with the Federal Government prior to her service with the Civic Unity Committee where she earned the respect of all who came in contact with her, in times of stress, by her diplomacy and ability to resolve differences of opinion during her tenure of seventeen years; and
- WHEREAS: In the death of Grace E. McLellan the City of Cambridge has lost a devoted family member who represented the highest ideals of public service; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: By the members of this City Council in session assembled on December 8, 1980, that we do hereby express our sorrow at the passing of Grace E. McLellan, and acknowledging the great contributions that she made to the civic life of Cambridge, extend to her sister, K. Margaret Woods and her brother, George Keough our heartfelt sympathy at their great loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be prepared and presented to her family in testimony of our love and respect for a grand lady who brought so much happiness to so many.
