The Committee on Roads and Bridges, having received information in reference to an alleged informality in the laying out of Spring street, between Sixth and Ninth streets, by the City Council of 1883, - asks leave to
Report

That it appears from the City records, that the customary order for taking the land in said Spring street for public use as a highway, was passed by the City Council in the latter part of the year 1883, said order being accompanied by a waiver of notice of such taking, which at the time was believed to contain the names of all persons interested in the matter. It is now alleged that one of the owners of land on said street did not sign the waiver of notice. For the purpose of correcting any informality that may exist in reference to the laying out of said street, Your Committee recommends, that new proceedings be taken thereon, and that the usual order of notice be issued, of the intention of the City Council to lay out said Spring street, between Sixth and Ninth streets, as a public way, such laying out
over.
