WHEREAS: Complaints are still being received regarding mail service, and indeed seem to be on the increase; and

WHEREAS: The officials of the U. S. Postal Service chose to walk out on a City Council hearing where discussion was taking place regarding said service; and

WHEREAS: The situation should not be allowed to continue and attempts at reorganization do not appear to be the answer; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request our Congressional Delegation to confer with the appropriate committees of the House and Senate who provide oversight to the Postal Service and with the Postmaster General to determine why the Boston Postmaster refused to stay at a public meeting to answer the concerns of the public and postal employees; and to request those committees to conduct a full scale investigation of our mail service.
