Dr. Leon B. Leach, 60

Practiced dentistry in Cambridge

Dr. Leon B. Leach of Belmont, who practiced dentistry in Cambridge for 33 years, died of cancer Tuesday at Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 60.

A graduate of Brown University and the Harvard School of Dental Medicine, Leach served on the staff of Harvard University's Holyoke Center.

He also studied psychoanalysis and worked as a therapist in Cambridge and as a volunteer at the Mystic Valley Mental Health Center in Lexington and at the Salvation Army in New York City.

Dr. Leach was an active member of the Massachusetts Dental Society, the Harvard Odontological Society, the Brown Club, the Boy Scouts, the Charles River Yacht Club and the Krishnamurti Foundation.

He leaves his wife, Maryann; a daughter, Andrea, and a son, Roger, both of Boston; and two brothers, Daniel of East Greenwich, R.I., and Charles of New York City.

A memorial service will be held Saturday at 11 a.m. in Memorial Church in Harvard Yard.
