James N. Gabriel, was judge, U.S. attorney, 68

Judge James N. Gabriel of Lexington, formerly of Cambridge, chief justice of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court from 1986 to 1990 and former U.S. attorney for Massachusetts, died Tuesday at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Brighton after a lengthy illness. He was 68.

Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., he resided in Cambridge most of his life. He had recently moved to Lexington.

Judge Gabriel graduated from Cambridge Latin School and from Boston College. He received his law degree from Boston College Law School in 1949 and was a graduate of New York University Graduate School of Law.

For six years, Judge Gabriel served as an assistant attorney general for Massachusetts before joining the U.S. attorney's office in Boston in 1969.

In 1972, he was named U.S. attorney for Massachusetts by then President Richard Nixon, a position he held until 1977 when he was appointed to the U.S. Bankruptcy Court.

For 19 years, Judge Gabriel also operated a private law practice in Boston.

A member of the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II, he was awarded pilots wings in 1944. He retired as a lieutenant colonel and staff advocate in the Air Force reserves.

Judge Gabriel was a member of the board of trustees for the New England School of Law and a past chairman of the Massachusetts Republican Committee.

He was a member of the Cambridge Republican Com-

mittee, the Young Republican Club of Cambridge and the Nicholas G. Beram Veterans Association of Boston.

Judge Gabriel also served several terms as chairman of the board of trustees at St. Mary's Orthodox Church of Cambridge.

He is survived by his wife, Helen R. (Rawan); five daughters, Gail S., T. Jane and Cynthia M., all of Cambridge, Andrea H. Gabriel-Jabbour of Connecticut and Helen E. of Lexington; his father, Samuel of Cambridge; a sister, Victoria M. Matthews of Connecticut; and six grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Judge Gabriel at 10 a.m. tomorrow in St. Mary's Orthodox Church, 8 Inman St., Cambridge.

Burial will be in Mount Auburn Cemetery, Cambridge.

Mary I. Healy of Jamaica Plain, registered nurse

Mary I. Healy of Jamaica Plain, a registered nurse, died Tuesday at Milton Hospital in Milton after a brief illness. She was 85.

Born in Boston, she was a resident of Jamaica Plain for many years.

She was a graduate of West Roxbury High School, the Mount Auburn School of Nursing and received a master's degree in nursing from Boston University.

Miss Healy worked as a school nurse and an attendance officer for the Boston school system for many years. She retired in 1974.

She also worked for five years at the Houghton-Mifflin book store.

From 1929-37, Miss Healy served in the Religious Sisters of the Cenacle in Long Island, N.Y.

During World War II, Miss Healy served as an second lieutenant with the U.S. Army in the Philippines.

She is survived by three brothers, William L. of Jamaica Plain, John F. of Oysterville and Maurice J. of Holiday, Fla.; and two sisters, Dorothy C. McDonald of Jamaica Plain and Eileen A. Ricci of Hamden, Conn.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Miss Healy at 10 a.m. today at St. Thomas Aquinas Church, 97 South St., Jamaica Plain.

Burial will be in Mount Benedict Cemetery, West Roxbury.

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of the Honorable James N. Gabriel, late Cambridge resident and Chief Justice of the United States Bankruptcy Court, from 1986 to 1990; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Gabriel, graduated from Cambridge Latin School and Boston College and from Boston College Law School in 1949 as well as receiving a graduate law degree from New York University; and
- WHEREAS: For six years, Judge Gabriel served as an assistant attorney general for Massachusetts before joining the United States Attorney's office in Boston in 1969, and in 1972, he was named the United States Attorney by then President Richard Nixon, a position he held until 1977 when he was appointed to the United States Bankruptcy Court; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Gabriel, prior to maintaining a private law practice for 19 years, served his country during World War II and a member of the United States Army and was awarded pilots wings in 1944 and upon being honorably discharged, entered the reserves, retiring as a lieutenant colonel and staff advocate in the United States Air Force; and
- WHEREAS: During his entire adult life, Judge Gabriel was always offering both his time and talents to those in need and to many civic organizations, including the Nicholas G. Beram Veterans Association of Boston, the board of trustees of St. Mary's Orthodox Church of Cambridge and the New England School of Law; now therefore be it;
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Helen R. Gabriel and to the entire Gabriel family at this time of such personal loss of a husband, father and noted jurist, and be it further;
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Gabriel on behalf of the entire City Council.
