Francis P. Madeiros, 80, Cambridge police officer

Francis P. Madeiros of Plymouth, a retired police officer, died Wednesday at his son's home in Plymouth after a lengthy illness. He was 80.

Born and raised in Cambridge, he attended Cambridge schools.

Mr. Madeiros served in the Army during World War II. He earned several medals, including the Good Conduct Medal, the Victory Medal, the Philippines Liberation Ribbon, the Asiatic Pacific Theater Campaign Ribbon and the Purple Heart.

He was a Cambridge police officer for 34 years.

He later was a supervisor for the National Biscuit Co. in

Cambridge. He also worked in the Quincy Shipyard.

Mr. Madeiros was a member of the Cambridge DAV and the VFW Post 8818 in Cambridge.

Husband of the late Jessie G. (Butt), Mr. Madeiros is survived by three sons, David of Plymouth, Allan of Pembroke and Paul of Tewksbury; one sister, Georgina Boc of Weymouth; 17 grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

A funeral service was held yesterday at Shepherd Funeral Home, Kingston.

Burial was in the Massachusetts National Cemetery in Bourne.
