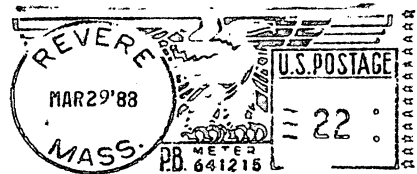


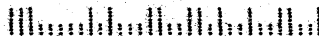

RESOLVE

WHEREAS: the residents of Revere have had to suffer for many months with odor-filled, undrinkable water, along with the residents of all the other cities and towns within the M.W.R.A., and

WHEREAS: such condition has forced many residents to feel compelled to purchase bottled water during this time period, therefore be it

RESOLVED: that this City Council hereby requests the Mayor to pursue all paths in order to rebate a portion of the residential water bills paid over the last six months based on the unacceptable quality of water delivered by the M.W.R.A., and be it further

RESOLVED: that Revere invite all other similarly situated communities to join in this effort to obtain financial satisfaction for inferior performance, and be it further

RESOLVED: that a copy of this Resolve be forwarded to His Honor, the Mayor, our state legislative delegation, the M.W.R.A., and to all cities and towns within the M.W.R.A.
