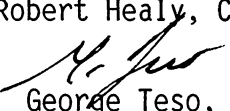

Subject City Council Order #28 of July 30, 1990, Re: Correspondence from Julie Ingelfinger

In regard to the circumstances leading up to the revocation and reinstatement of a visitor permit issued to Julie Ingelfinger, 3 Gray Gardens West is as follows:

1. On July 9, 1990 one of our Parking Control Officers while on her route observed two visitor permits on two different vehicles parked near 3 Gray Gardens West with identical identification numbers. Upon further investigation, it was found that one of the permits was a photostatic copy. The officer therefore reported this to her supervisor.
2. On July 17, 1990, a call was made to the person the permit was issued to and the daughter answered the telephone and stated that their housekeeper had made a photostatic copy of the permit and was using it on her vehicle and she also stated we were harassing her. A copy of the City Ordinance and a revocation notice was sent to Mrs. Ingelfinger along with suggestions on what she could do to solve this problem.
3. On July 20, 1990, I received a letter from Mrs. Julie Ingelfinger returning her permit and the circumstances that led up to the revocation. The letter was dated July 17, 1990.
4. On July 20, 1990, I reinstated Mrs. Ingelfinger's permit and advised her on the use of visitor permits.

This is our usual procedure when we find that a visitor permit is being copied or abused which is illegal according to a City Ordinance. We do call or write to the person to determine if they are aware of what is happening and in most cases we do not revoke the permits.

Our Parking Control Officers are only doing their job and not harassing people.
