That the City Council record its tribute of keen appreciation to Dr. Joseph M. Wadden for the services rendered as a member of the Board of Health since 1920.

Dr. Wadden, in addition to being a member of the Board of Health, served as a School Physician for a number of years. During the war, while Dr. Bradford Pierce was in the Naval service, it was necessary for Dr. Wadden to take on the additional duties of Medical Inspector which duties he performed with credit to himself and to the City.

In accepting his resignation as a member of the Board his associates complimented him on his "long, continued, devoted, conscientious and efficient service." And such it was; for during the past two decades the Board of Health made rapid strides in enlarging the scope of their preventative work and the records of the department bear silent testimony to that conscientious and efficient public service.
