COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: Harvard University and M.I.T. occupy forty percent of the land area of the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Any actions taken by these institutions relative to new construction, housing, security, land use and expansion has a direct effect on the life and well-being of all citizens of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: This City Council has endeavored, through legislation to respond to the pressures produced by the growth of these Universities, but has not engaged in the actual policy decisions and planning which accompany these growing institutions and deems it necessary that a new bridge be built along the Charles to further strengthen the town and gown relations which have existed in the past; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That this City Council go on record requesting the President and Fellows of Harvard College and Trustees of M.I.T. to take the legal action necessary to provide for a change in their Corporate Charters, in order that the City Manager of the City of Cambridge be allowed to sit as a voting member representing the citizenry of Cambridge in their respective governing bodies.
