

- WHEREAS: The current composition of boards and commissions in the City of Cambridge does not fully and fairly represent the talent and diversity of the city; and
- WHEREAS: Members of one board or commission may be, and are, appointed to other boards and commissions; and
- WHEREAS: The membership of a number of Cambridge boards and commissions includes individuals who have served for long periods; ~~and/or have been reappointed repeatedly;~~ now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That it shall be the policy of the City of Cambridge:
- (1) to appoint more working class, minority, and low-income people to the city's boards and commissions;
 - (2) to limit terms of board and commission members to no more than three (3) years, or as provided by law;
 - ~~(3) to reappoint an individual to the same board or commission only on the basis of exceptional service and merit and not prior to at least one (1) year following the end of the last term served; and~~
 - ³~~(4)~~ not to appoint an individual already serving on a Cambridge board or commission to a second board or commission of the city if the term of the first appointment and the term of the second appointment overlap more than six (6) months; and be it further
