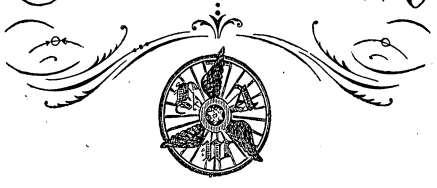

BOSTON, February 10, 1889.

DEAR SIRs:

Chapter 162 of the Acts of 1887 provides as follows, viz.:—

“Every town shall, in the manner provided in this Chapter (Chapter 53 of the Public Statutes), erect and maintain guide-posts on the highways and other ways within the town at such places as are necessary or convenient for the direction of travellers, and *shall* erect and maintain such guide-posts at such forks or intersections of such highways and other ways as lead to adjoining towns or cities.”

By it you will see that it is compulsory upon cities and towns to erect and maintain such guide-posts as shall comply with Section IV., Chapter 53, Public Statutes.

The League of American Wheelmen, an organization of gentlemen interested in cycling, have determined to see that the law is fully complied with. We send you this notice in order that you may ask for suitable appropriations at your town meeting.

It is not only cyclers who are interested in this movement, but all who travel along our highways.

It is the intention of the Committee to prosecute, at an early day, such places as do not comply with the law.
