

Memorandum of a contract this day made
by and between Edwin Carney of Rockport
in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and
the City of Cambridge a municipal corporation
legally established in said Commonwealth.

The said Carney agrees to deliver at the
city wharf, Main street, near West Boston
Bridge in said Cambridge at such times
and in such quantities as may be required
by the Superintendent of streets for the time
being of said Cambridge eighty thousand
granite paving blocks (more or less as shall
thus be required) equal in quality to the best
Cape Ann or Quincy Granite. Said blocks
are to be not less than three and one half
inches nor more than four inches in width
not less than six inches nor more than
eight inches in length, and not less than
seven and one half inches nor more than
eight inches in depth. All the edges to be
sharp and straight forming right angles

at their intersections both horizontally and vertically,
- the faces to be straight split and free from
bunches or depressions - each and every block
to be equal to the sample furnished both as
regards quality and finish and to be in every
respect satisfactory to the Committee on Roads
and Bridges and the Superintendent of streets
of said City of Cambridge for the time being.

The said City of Cambridge agrees to pay to said
Carrier for the stones thus supplied and delivered
at the rate of thirty-three dollars per thousand for
the first forty thousand, and at the rate of
thirty-seven dollars per thousand for all
the rest. This contract to continue until Jan 1. 1886
