- WHEREAS:** It has come to the attention of this City Council that on Sunday, April 26, 1981 Father Henry Barry will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving on the occasion of his Fortieth Anniversary of his ordination to the Priesthood; and
- WHEREAS:** Father Barry, having attended Saint John's Seminary was ordained in 1941 at the Holy Cross Cathedral and subsequently received his first parish assignment at Saint Thomas More Church in Braintree, serving from May, 1941 to July, 1945; and
- WHEREAS:** Father Barry was assigned to Saint John the Evangelist Church in North Cambridge from July, 1945 and served that parish and community with dedication until February, 1965 at which time he was assigned to Saint Mary of the Angels Church in Roxbury; and
- WHEREAS:** Father Barry in October of 1968 was returned to the parish which he truly calls home, Saint John the Evangelist serving the parish as its Pastor and Spiritual leader for the past thirteen years; and
- WHEREAS:** Father Barry's leadership, thoughtfulness and dedication has been a guiding light for the many parishioners of St. John's who consider him not only as "Father Confessor" but also as their friend; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending our sincere congratulations to Father Henry Barry as he celebrates the occasion of his Fortieth Anniversary to the Priesthood and further extend our best wishes for much happiness and good health as he continues his pastoral responsibilities at St. John's; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare for presentation a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for Father Barry on behalf of the entire City Council.
