RESOLUTION OF RESPECT

- WHEREAS: On the Thirty-first day of October, 1984, death brought to a close the active life of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi of India; and
- WHEREAS: Indira Gandhi ruled the most populous democracy in the world for sixteen years, presiding over a nation of many cultures and languages, and was a champion for the rights and independence of Third World countries; and
- WHEREAS: In the death of Indira Gandhi, the world has lost a leader who carried on the tradition of public service in the best family tradition of her father, Jawaharial Nehru, who led the infant nation for seventeen years after its independence from Britain in 1947, who succeeded her grandfather, Mortial Nehru, an early leader in the Indian independence movement; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor and the City Council of Cambridge, Massachusetts, does by this resolution and public record, recognize the profound influence of Indira Gandhi upon the political and economic life of India, and the nations of the Third World, recognizing that her death is a great loss to the nation that she served so well; and be it furtehr
- RESOLVED: That this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this City Council, and a copy thereof be sent to her son, Rajiv Gandhi, in recognition of her contributions to India and the nations of the world.
