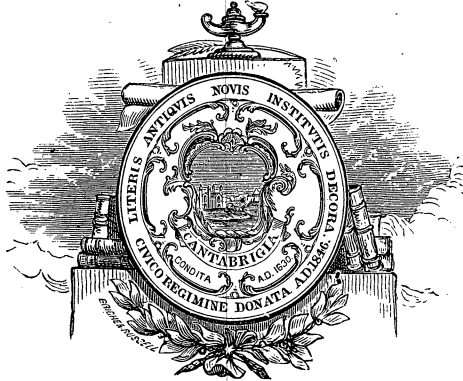


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, *December 13th 1871*

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that *Dunster Street* should be widened upon its westerly side thereof

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *Dunster Street*

as is included between the *red & black* lines shown on a plan of *Dunster* Street, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *Nov 18th 1871* and now before this Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Dunster* Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said widening be estimated and awarded as follows:

To the Union Railway Co

For 122 square feet of land \$3. \$366.00

Ordered, That Six months, be allowed to the persons whose land is
taken for said widening for the removal of the building standing
on the land so taken as aforesaid.

Adopted. Sent down for concurrence.
