In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 14,
1858.

Ordered, Whereas a Private Way in Ward Two, called Cotton Street, has heretofore been dedicated to the public use by the owners of adjoining lands, and is now in a fit condition to become a public highway; and whereas it is adjudged by the Mayor and Aldermen that the public necessity and convenience require that said street be laid out as a public highway, and that no persons will be damaged thereby, and are entitled to any compensation from the City; therefore

Ordered, That said private way be and hereby is laid out and established as a public highway by the name of Cotton Street, agreeably to a Plan thereof, drawn by Alex. Wadsworth, bearing date Aug. 10, 1853, a Copy of which Plan is now before this Board to run from Harvard Street to Broadway, the same to be forty feet in width, as delineated in said Plan.
