WHEREAS: The events taking place on June 6, 1944 had a profound bearing on the outcome of World War II; and

WHEREAS: All those who treasure justice, democracy and peace recognize the hardships and sacrifices demanded from and accepted by those men and women from Cambridge and throughout the country who have defended our land in times of peace and of war; and

WHEREAS: We are proud of and grateful to these brave patriots; and

WHEREAS: June 6, 1994 marks the fiftieth anniversary of D-DAY; and

WHEREAS: For what Allied Commander Dwight David Eisenhower called the "great crusade" to liberate Europe from Nazi domination, the Allies mustered 7,000 ships, 11,000 aircraft, and over three million men and women; and

WHEREAS: When France was finally liberated in August of 1944, the cost to the Allied armies totalled 153,000 wounded and 37,000 dead; and

WHEREAS: In the words of an inscription at Arlington National Cemetery, "they served not for place or for rank, not lured by ambition or guided by necessity, but in simple obedience to duty as they understood it"; now therefore

RESOLVED: That June 6, 1994 is proclaimed to be D-DAY REMEMBRANCE DAY in Cambridge, to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the Allied landing on Normandy, and all the brave men and women who fought for freedom and democracy in the Second World War; and be it further.

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RESOLVED: That our hearts go out in tender appreciation to the many Cantabrigians who gave their lives to liberty.
