Caroline Sears Warren Black died on February 5, 2001 at home in Beaufort, South Carolina. She was 77 years old. Born in 1923 in Pride's Crossing, Massachusetts to Bayard Warren and Eliabeth Sears Warren, she was the granddaughter of S.D. Warren, founder of the S.D. Warren Paper Company. She graduated from Foxcroft School in Virginia and, during World War II, worked in the Underwater Sound Laboratory in Cambridge, Massachusetts. An active horsewoman and pianist from her youth she learned to sail after her marriage in 1945 to Peter Black, grandson of Charles H. Taylor, Co-founder of the Boston Globe. Caroline and Peter completed two transatlantic crossings aboard their 47' Ketch, The Caroline, in 1987. To prepare for the trip, Caroline earned a ham radio operators license and became the first woman to graduate from the General Motors Diesel Engine School in Detroit, Michigan. Through-out her lifetime Caroline was a dedicated community volunteer, serving in various capacities with the League of Woman Voter's in Connecticut and Maryland. Her areas of interest included land use issues and voter registration as well as hospice care and equal access to education. She is survived by her husband, Peter Black of Beaufort, South Carolina, her sons, William M. Black, MD of Beaufort, Sylvia Black, of Beaufort and Seattle, Washington and Caroline Boutard, of Portland, Oregon. She also leaves behind five grandchildren.
