RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 463

AN ACT DESIGNATING THE COMMUNITY TELEVISION

SYSTEMS AS THE CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEMS AND

REGULATING FEES

- WHEREAS: License (franchise) fees and application fees in the State of Massachusetts are the lowest in the country at fifty cents (.50) per subscriber, and one hundred dollars (\$100.), respectively; and
- WHEREAS: Senate Bill 463 seeks to address this difference by adjusting the license fee to 3% of gross revenue with 1% going to the State, and 2% to the city or town, and by adjusting the application fees to five thousand (\$5,000.) dollars for cities the size of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Senate Bill 463 offers substantial incentives to cable operators to maintain stable rate structures; and
- WHEREAS: Provisions are also made for protection of landlord and tenant rights and properties during installation and ongoing maintenance of a cable television system; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council voice its support for Senate Bill 463 which seeks to assist cities and towns, landlords and tenants, subscribers and potential subscribers in protecting their vital interests in this area; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a copy of this resolution to the members of the Cambridge Legislative Delegation.

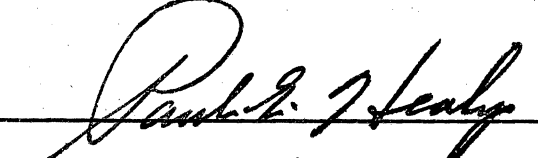
