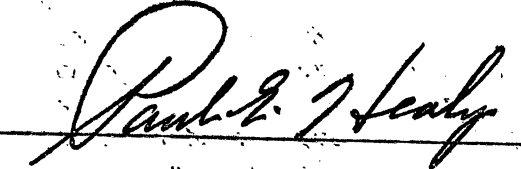

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Joseph J. Keating, a lifelong Cantabrigian and retired Cambridge Police Officer; and
- WHEREAS: Officer Keating attended local schools and graduated from the former Rindge Technical High School and in 1945 was appointed to the Cambridge Police Department, holding varying patrol duties, including serving as a member of the Department's motorcycle unit for many years and as a Patrol Officer in Kendall Square for eighteen years prior to his retirement in 1978 from a job he truly loved and which saw him cited on numerous occasions for outstanding police work; and
- WHEREAS: During his spare time Joe loved boating and all its related activities and often could be found speaking at public hearings on boating issues; his strong support was instrumental in bringing about improved boating facilities on the Charles River, where he moored his boat for the past thirty years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Keating family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family at this time of such personal loss.
