Residential housing is a threatened commodity in this city. The C.A.R.D.'s compound that threat. The program itself can be a benefit to Cambridge. But we must not lose a single home, because of CARD incentives. Unless some form of safe guarding residences is created for these CARD Districts my feeling is that no CARD is better than a destructive CARD.
