You have asked my opinion concerning the Order of the City Council dated March 20, 1972 concerning voter registration after the Election Commission referred to me for report the first two requests of the Order.

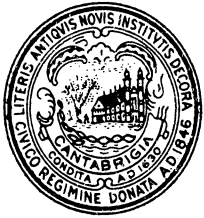
As to the first request, I can see no objection to making public a list of applicants who have filed for appeal, and that should be done.


