life
key elements involved in living,
security of life, access to shelter, access
to education, security of a home, earning a
living, security of work or business
operations, property, money, security of
health and all things which affect health,
such as the health of nature.

liberty

freedom from tyranny, secure
government, access to justice, freedom* of
speech, publication, movement, freedom of
material and spiritual belief.

pursuit of happiness

non interference with freedom to
pursue own style of happiness in all things,
freedom of marriage, freedom of group
happiness. Group refers to any group such as
a business organization or societal
community.

Government by the Consent of the Governed.
The Governed are not slaves or tax slaves.
The Government must obtain the Consent of the
Governed on all actions affecting the
Governed's Unalienable Rights.

Consent is not to be interpreted as receiving the vote to hold office, since
at the time of election the voters are not The Governed. It is while the
Elected are in office that The People are The Governed and therefore the
Elected (The Government) must obtain the Consent of the Governed regarding
anything which affects The Governed's Unalienable Rights.

How shall we know whether the Constitution is succeeding ? By monitoring it
in relation to how well The People's Unalienable Rights are secure. This
vital links proves that The Declaration and Constitution are inextricably
connected.

Freedome defined as acts which do not deny others their unalienable rights.
