

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and
Seventy Five,

An Ordinance in relation to collection of junk
and other articles, —

Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows,

Chapter Fourteen of the Revised Ordinances is
hereby amended by striking out the second
section thereof as heretofore amended, and
inserting in its place the following,

Sect. 2. No person shall, without a license
from the Mayor and Aldermen, collect or deal
in junk, old metals, rags, grease, bones, or
second hand articles; and no person thus
licensed shall, directly or indirectly, either
purchase or receive by way of exchange or
barter, any of said articles of any mi-
nor, knowing or having reason to believe
him to be such. Every person receiving
such a license shall pay for the same to
the use of the City of Cambridge, a fee
of five dollars before the delivery thereof
to him, and no license shall be trans-
ferable.

Every vehicle used in the collection of
junk, old metals, rags, grease, bones or
second hand articles, shall be at all
times subject to the inspection of the
Mayor and Aldermen, or of any person
by them authorized, and shall have
the name of the owner and the number
of his license placed upon the outside
of each side thereof in plain legible
words and figures of not less than one
and one half inches in length, and so
that the same may be distinctly seen.
