- WHEREAS: "Employ the Handicapped" should become a living reality in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas W. Danehy, Mayor of the City of Cambridge do hereby proclaim the week of October 1-7, 1978, as "EMPLOY THE HANDICAPPED WEEK." I urge all government and business leaders and all citizens of Cambridge to participate in local and state activities which help the handicapped to live happy and useful lives.
