The undersigned respectfully prays
that he may be permitted, at his own expense,
to lay flagging along the middle line of the sidewalk
next his residence, 156 Brattle St., and to lay the rest of
of the sidewalk in grass; the flagging to be three feet wide
in a double row of flags (Hudson River) on the Brattle St.
sidewalk, two feet wide in a single row on Lowell St.
This is deemed sufficient for present needs at this
point and can in no way interfere with enlarge-
ment by stone or brick at any future time if
needed.
