Establishing the Salary of the Mayor of the
City of Cambridge

Sec. 1. There shall hereafter be paid to
the Mayor of the City of Cambridge an an-
nual Salary of Eight hundred dollars, in
equal quarterly payments of two hundred
dollars each; which shall be in full
for services rendered in his official capacity.

Sec. 2. an ordinance "Establishing the Salary
of the Mayor of the City of Cambridge"
passed March 22 1847, is hereby Repealed.

Sec. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect
from and after the first Monday in
April of the present year.

An Ordinance,
establishing the Salary of the Mayor of the City
of Cambridge.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. There shall hereafter be paid to the Mayor of the City of Cambridge an annual salary of eight hundred dollars, in equal quarterly payments of two hundred dollars each; which shall be in full for services rendered in his official capacity.

2. An Ordinance, "establishing the Salary of the Mayor of the City of Cambridge", passed March 22, 1847, is hereby repealed.

3. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the first Monday in April of the present year.
