COUNCILLOR CLINTON

- WHEREAS: The Sheriff of Middlesex County has proposed that the jail in the new Court Building in East Cambridge be used to house prisoners from Boston, and
- WHEREAS: This suggestion is outrageous in that it would bring to Cambridge prisoners that were in no way connected with Middlesex County or the City of Cambridge, and
- WHEREAS: It is enough that we assume our share of the correctional burden without in addition taking on the burdens of other counties, and
- WHEREAS: Above all, this proposal has caused tremendous unrest in the East Cambridge neighborhood and has made area residents deeply concerned and worried about this plan, therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council officially go on record as being opposed to any proposal that would house prisoners from another County in the newly constructed East Cambridge jail.
