IN CITY COUNCIL
February 6, 1974

WHEREAS:

John F. O'Hell, a former employee of the Fire Department of the City of Cambridge, entered the service of the Fire Department on October 26, 1936 and was pensioned on December 27, 1961 under the provisions of Chapter 32 Section 37, of the General Laws and died on December 20, 1973 having served not less than twenty-five years, and

WHEREAS:

at the time of his death said employee had no rights to elect that benefits be paid to his survivor, said employee leaves as his survivor, his widow, Mrs. Catherine O'Hell, who has not remarried and is not receiving any retirement allowance or pension under the provisions of any general or special law, therefore be it

ORDERED:

That, under the provisions of Chapter 32 Section 101 of the General Laws, retroactively within and amendments thereto, that in order to promote the public good, and in consideration of the long and meritorious services performed by John F. O'Hell, an annuity be granted to Mrs. Catherine O'Hell, widow of John F. O'Hell, of \$1,500.00 per year as long as she does not remarry.


