PETITION FOR SPEED BUMPS on Agassiz Streets being re-paved this fall.

The residential side streets between Oxford Street and Beacon Street are frequently used by vehicles to get between Cambridge and Somerville. In an area already congested and heavily used for on-street parking, this additional traffic creates noise and endangers children and other pedestrians. As residents of this area, we would like the City to take every possible measure to reduce and to slow down the through traffic. Most urgently, we request that the imminent re-paving of these side streets* (in connection with the sewer separation project) **include strategically located speed bumps**. We believe that such bumps could be designed so as not to impede storm water flow, if they were extended only across the middle of the street (i.e., not extended to the curbs). **We urge you to make speed bumps a reality on our busy streets. Thank you very much.**

*Specifically: Carver, Crescent, Eustis, Gorham, Hammond, Howland, Museum, Sacramento, and Wendell Streets.

It was not our intention to suggest a speed bump on each of the blocks being repaved. We assume the city's experts will determine where a few such bumps would be most effective in decreasing the volume and speed of through traffic.
