le against Fresh Pond leash law

WEST CAMBRIDGE

At the committee's May 12 meeting, it was agreed that the Cambridge Water Department begin a comprehensive study of Fresh Pond watershed protection. The department will be receiving proposals for the study by June, according to Nancy Barnes, managing director of the water department.

Meanwhile, the city manager will coordinate a study of the reservation which takes the concerns of dog owners, walkers, joggers, and bicyclists into account. These studies will take several months at least, according to Wolf.

"Here is this great natural resource, and we need to use it better," she said.

The ordinance committee will also recommend that the city hire a park ranger for the reservation. "The potential of a park ranger is very exciting," said Wolf.

Complicating matters is a temporary leash law at Fresh Pond that is in effect because of an area-wide rabies threat.

It was noted at the meeting that 50 to 90 percent of dog owners were not even complying with this temporary law. Wolf sees this as a possible concern for any permanent leash law.

The Fresh Pond Reservation is one of the last municipal areas in Cambridge where there are no permanent leash laws in effect.



James Tingle, 65; retired city employee, former owner of Yellow Cab Co.

James "Cotton" Tingle died May 15 after a brief illness. He was 65.

Born in Arapahoe, N.C., he studied finance and insurance at Northeastern University. He was a veteran of both World War II and Korea.

He was owner of Yellow Cab Co. from 1969 to 1974. Since 1973, he had been employed by the City of Cambridge as an assistant coordinator of the Longfellow Community School and, most recently, as an outreach worker for the fuel assistance program. He retired in 1990.

He was husband of Frances (DeGuglielmo) Tingle; father of James Jr., Garrett, Ruth, and Robert; brother of Evelyn DeGuglielmo of Cambridge.

A funeral Mass was held Tuesday at St. Mary's Church in Cambridge, followed by a burial in the Tingle Family Cemetery in Arapahoe, N.C.

Born in Arapahoe, N.C., Mr. Tingle attended Northeastern University and studied finance and insurance.

Mr. Tingle was the owner of Yellow Cab Co. of Newton from 1969 to 1974.
