Re: Breeding of bees


Dear Sir:

Please be advised that there is no ordinance in the City of Cambridge, nor any provision in the Massachusetts General Laws, which either restricts or regulates the breeding of bees.

I am aware of recent complaints by various citizens who feel that this type of breeding presents a health hazard. However, the Law Department must await an order from the City Council before any action can be taken with regard to this matter.

Please advise the City Council that the City Solicitor's Office will be happy to draft an ordinance relative to the breeding of bees upon receipt of a Council Order.
