COUNCILLOR SULLIVAN

WHEREAS: The strike of Catholic cemetery workers has now entered its 12th week causing tremendous hardship to the workers, funeral directors and the families of the deceased; and

WHEREAS: Many local funeral directors have been faced with a severe problem of retaining the remains of the deceased for such an elongated period of time that they are now reaching a crisis; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Commissioner of Public Works with a view in mind of establishing a schedule whereby local funeral directors could utilize the storage facilities of the Cambridge Cemetery until such time as this strike is over; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to submit a report to this Council within two weeks as to the action taken by him pursuant to this order.
