

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, June 4th 1883.

Ordered,

That the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges be and hereby is authorized and directed to cause brick sidewalks, with suitable stone curbing where the latter are required, ^{to be laid} upon the streets hereinafter named, to wit:—

On Buckingham street from Concord Avenue to the south line of estate of Martha B. Cilley, it being on the east side of said street,

On South side of Lenox street, from the rear line of estate of Henry Potter to a point about 50 ft. easterly,

On Southwest side of Green street in front of estates of John Bochiene and George E. Bollen, numbered 50 to 60 inclusive on said street.

On the west side of Sixth street in front of estate no. 25 on said street.

On the west side of Fourth street in front of estate no. 101 on said street.

On the east side of Elm street, between Broadway and Hampshire streets, (such portions of the sidewalk as are not already laid in brick.)

The expense of the brick sidewalks and curb-stones as above-named, to be charged to the appropriation for Street Department, (Paving), and assessment to be made ^{therefor} upon abutting estates according to law.
