WHEREAS: At its July 26, 1999 meeting, the City Council indicated its interest in considering amendments to the Zoning Ordinance in the areas of below-grade setbacks and permitted uses in accessory buildings; and

WHEREAS: The discussion at the meeting raised many questions and illustrated the need for information and analysis in order to craft coherent policy in those areas; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager confer with the Assistant City Manager for Community Development Department, the Commissioner of Inspectional Services and the Executive Director of the Historical Commission to provide relevant information and analysis regarding accessory buildings and below-grade setbacks for discussion at a meeting of the Housing and Community Development Department Committee in mid-September, and be it further

ORDERED: That said material shall include information as to the number of building permits for new construction or substantial renovation of accessory buildings in residential zones in the last three years; the number and type of complaints received regarding accessory buildings and their use; and the policy considerations for and against making changes in the existing zoning relative to these issues.

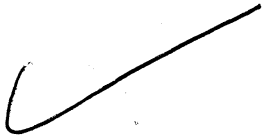
