ORDERED:

That the City Manager is requested to meet with the City Solicitor to prepare and to submit to the Massachusetts Legislature within thirty (30) days from the date hereof, a Home Rule Petition enabling the City of Cambridge to have the option of taxing for water and sewer use on the basis of a classification system whereby industrial, commercial and institutional users would pay a proportionately higher water and sewer rate than residential users and that said residential category be further classified or broken down on an equitable basis.
