- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of the City Council that the Sheraton Commander Hotel will be celebrating its 75th Anniversary; and
- WHEREAS: The Sheraton Commander opened its doors in 1927 just steps away from the Cambridge Common, near the site where General George Washington took command of the Continental Army in 1775; and
- WHEREAS: This hotel is also the site where John F. Kennedy announced his candidacy for Congress of the United States, and years later his nephew announced his own candidacy in the very same ballroom; and
- WHEREAS: This hotel is the perfect point from which to experience the culture of the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The Sheraton Commander has 175 rooms including 14 deluxe suites and 9 executive king suites; and
- WHEREAS: This wonderful hotel has five function rooms, ranging in seating capacity from serving a small meeting to a grand function of up to 400 people; and
- WHEREAS: Recent renovations have restored the George Washington and Mount Vernon Ballrooms to display their 1927 workmanship; and
- WHEREAS: The Sheraton Commander Hotel was purchased by the Guleserian Family in 1960; and
- WHEREAS: The Hotel is now under the stewardship of the 3rd generation of the Guleserian Family – in the able hands of Michael Guleserian as General Manager; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record extending a very Happy 75th Anniversary wish to the Sheraton Commander Hotel and to encourage all to experience what this exquisite hotel has to offer within the confines of historic Harvard Square; and be it further
